Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome to the Grade 3 Family!

Thank you for choosing Assumption and sharing with our mission to form and bring out the best in your CHILD. To facilitate her adjustment to Grade 3, please take note of the following guidelines:

- 1. During class hours, parents, guardians, caregivers, and drivers who wait for the children must stay in the waiting area near the Main Gate.
- 2. Parents who wish to consult with teachers may request for appointments through your child's assignment notebook. Kindly wait for the teacher's confirmation.
- 3. Students must come and leave school in complete uniform from Monday to Friday, except during P.E. days. The official I.D. and name tag prepared by the teacher must be worn at all times.
- 4. We encourage simplicity. Having birthday parties and wearing jewelry in school are discouraged. Hair accessories, when appropriate, must be in shades of red, black, or white.
- 5. A locker will be provided for each child. Please label all the things and materials of your child. These include books, notebooks, pencils, pencil case, folders, and other personal belongings in the grooming kit. The grooming kit may either be a kiddie shoe box or small bag that can fit in the locker. It must contain the following:
 - extra underwear, shorts, and t-shirt
 - hand sanitizer
 - insect repellant
 - comb or hairbrush
 - cologne or powder
 - · face towel and bath soap

- two rolls of tissue
- toothbrush and toothpaste
- eating utensils (reusable spoon, fork, plate and glass)
- eco-bag
- rag

The grooming kit should be ready on or before June 27, Tuesday.

 Prepare healthy food just enough for your daughter to finish. Food and drinks for recess and lunch should be placed in reusable food containers to minimize trash. Cloth placemat should be included in their lunch bag every day.
